From the Principal's Desk



Divine Intervention School is a co-educational school that caters to students from nursery up to Class X. It was dedicated on 15 October 2005 at Luangmual Vengthlang, Aizawl, by C. Rosiama, Senior Executive Secretary of the Presbyterian Church of India, Mizoram.

One of the determining factors of a good school is its academic culture. It is the primary source of competition among the top schools, as is shown in the high importance placed on the board examination results each year. All schools are highly motivated to place their students at the top of the ranking lists. Divine Intervention School is no exception, and its commitment to high academic standards is reflected in its good results every year.

Although Divine Intervention School considers academic achievement to be very important, it is distinguished from many other schools by its main objective, which is to create a **Christ-centric ministry oriented education**. It tries to inculcate in the students a willingness to fulfill any duty that they are assigned when serving God and the nation. In order to reinforce this main objective, Divine Intervention School places great importance on its chosen theme, "**I can do all things through Christ who strengthens me.**" Every student comes to understand and treasure this theme during the course of their time at the school, so that it remains with them for the rest of their life.

In establishing a Christ-centric ministry oriented education, all the staff are expected to set an example in character, behavior and lifestyle to the children. This helps children become motivated to do great things for God and their nation. The children receive clear instructions to do the will of God during their school days. Divine Intervention School is proud to employ faithful and strong believers who are humble, smart, well-educated and people of integrity.

R. Zochhawna and his wife B.C. Chami were missionaries with the Baptist Church of Mizoram for two decades, serving God in remote corners of India. After gaining experience of school leadership in the mission field, they felt called to take early retirement to begin a dedicated school in Aizawl. It was commissioned in 2005 along with its parent organization Divine Intervention Ministry India. It is a non-denominational organization aimed at bringing about balanced development in various aspects of society. Its first project is the school, which is based on solid principles of faith for the benefit of children from a variety of backgrounds and from all corners of Mizoram.

The school is established with a mission to educate the children to be the next generation of national leaders, missionaries, church leaders and society leaders in order to bring about transformation in the lives of human beings by training and equipping students with the required knowledge and skills so that they shall become responsible and useful citizens of India.

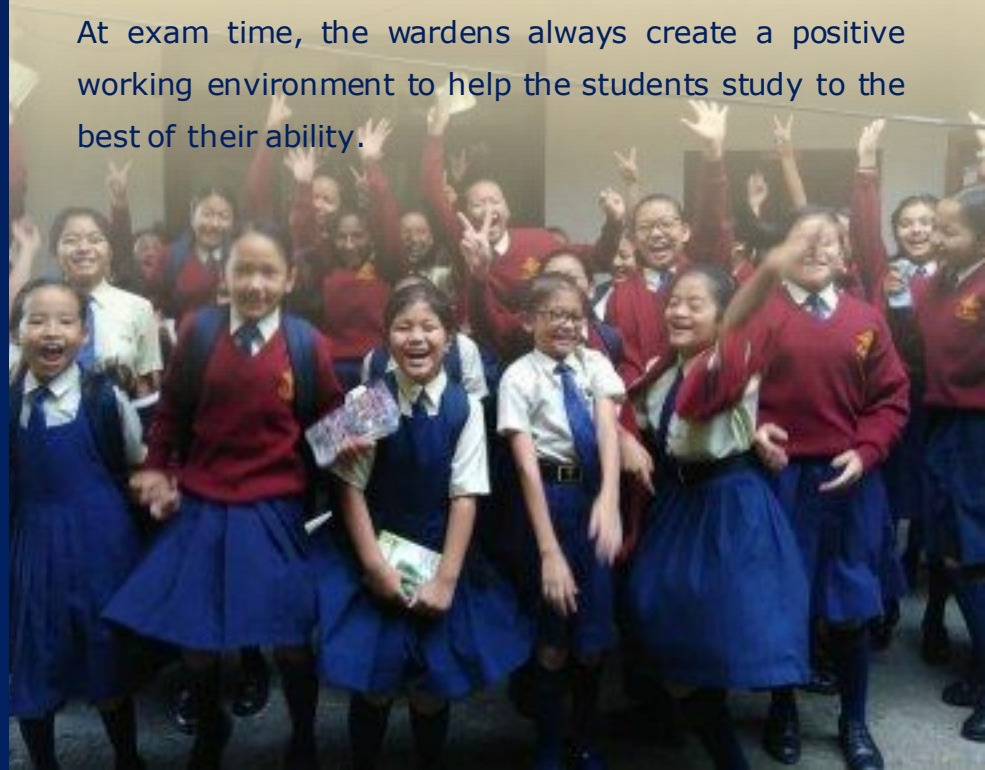
Hostel



The school hostel helps us to fulfill our vision to reach out to students of every background. We are proud to have residents from every district in Mizoram. There is a boys' and girls' hostel within the school, with a warden for the girls, a warden for the big boys and a warden for the small boys. We are a registered and approved hostel, and receive good reports each year.

Hostellers enjoy the modern facilities and provisions, including healthy food served every day. Table tennis and other sporting activities can be enjoyed, and there are opportunities to pursue other hobbies such as music and art. Hostel life involves regular worship throughout the week, especially on Sundays. There are many special events that the hostellers look forward to, such as picnic outings, talent shows, candlelit dinners and gospel crusades.

At exam time, the wardens always create a positive working environment to help the students study to the best of their ability.



The purpose-built premises in Zonuam, Aizawl has a safe place for children to play away from the main road as well as limited space for parking. The school offers a private bus service which makes it easy for students all over Aizawl to attend as day scholars.

The well-equipped classrooms and multimedia facilities enable students to have a more interactive learning experience. Numerous progressive teaching materials and methods are used, especially to promote literacy in the lowest classes.

School



The ever-growing library caters to every academic field of interest. It consists of more than 4,000 books that are useful for students of all ages, from those learning to read for the first time to those preparing for their Class X exams.

Science laboratory materials are available and are used to give students the necessary practical knowledge and experience of chemistry, physics and biology.

Divine Intervention School has extremely talented faculty teachers who are highly qualified in a range of subjects including Hindi, Music, Scripture and Personal Health. The ICSE syllabus is followed in the Middle Classes and for the HSLC Exam the school follows the MBSE Board. A significant proportion of the students' final grade is based on creative co-curricular activity work. We sometimes have visiting sports coaches and in 2018 we started a special training contract in collaboration with the Mizoram Table Tennis Association. Interested students have the chance to learn new skills.

Facilities



The school has a dedicated nurse and a visiting doctor. The doctor makes occasional visits to give the students a medical check-up. The nurse is on call at all times of the day or night. She takes the initiative of taking students to consult a medical expert when necessary. The school is well-equipped with suitable first aid supplies and medicine.

Competitions

Every year, teachers take the initiative to organise a variety of talent competitions for singing, dancing, elocution, debating and other similar activities. The standard is always most impressive and students have the chance to develop skills for the future.

Foundation Week celebrates the anniversary of the school's dedication every October and is usually the culmination point of all the main school competitions where the best students showcase their talents.

Some students have the chance to compete at State or National levels, in events such as Quiz or Painting Competitions. The school has an enthusiastic Energy Club which has also been very successful in recent years.



Sports

The annual sports days are very popular, and we always participate actively in State tournaments, especially basketball, table tennis and football (Reliance Foundation). We also promote parading and Mizo cultural dancing.

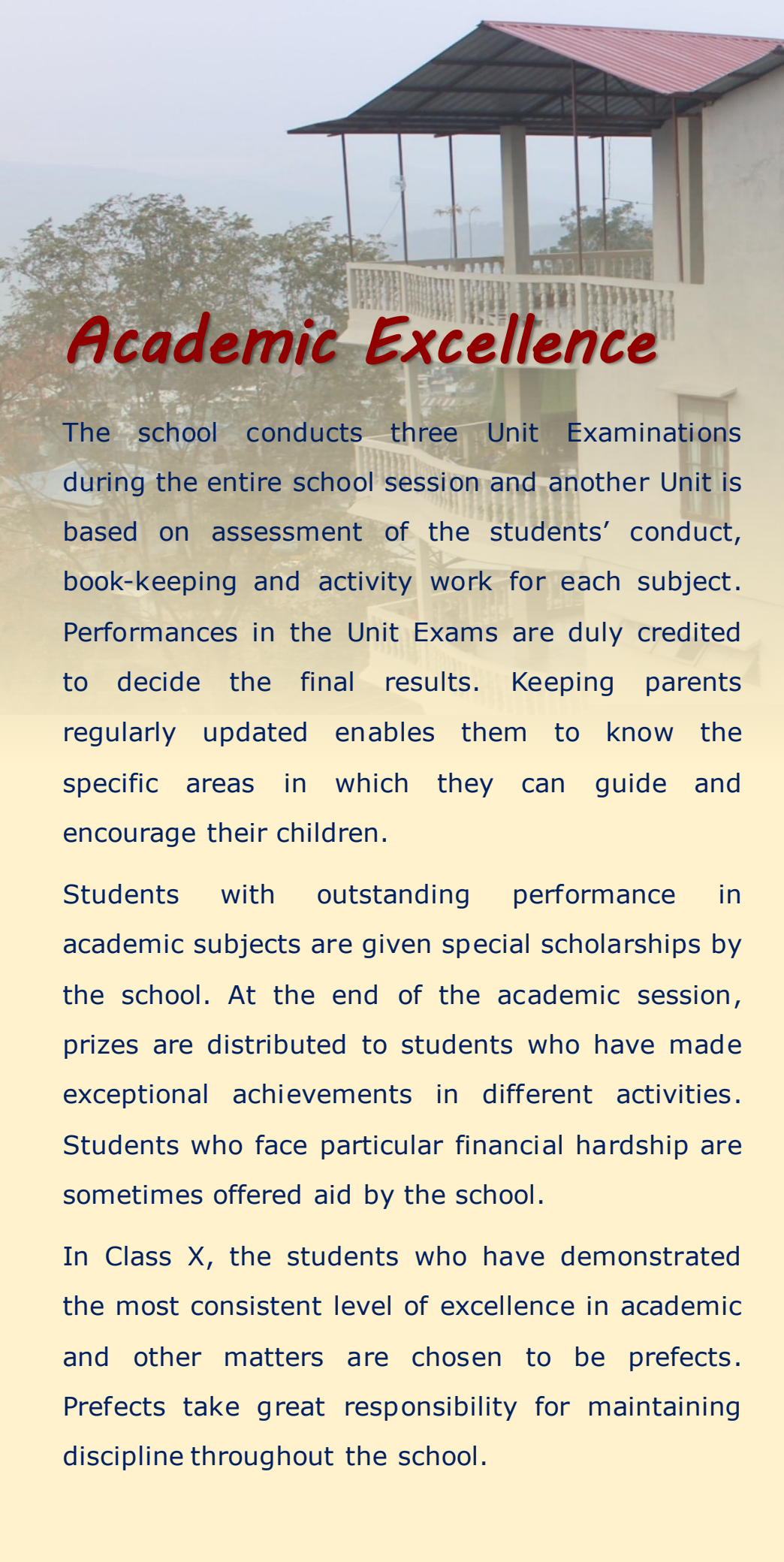
Christian Worship

The school seeks to help the students put Christ at the centre of their lives. Morning devotion for the whole school takes place on alternate days of the week and the younger classes meet for Devotion on the other days. All the teachers are expected to give importance to worship and are often given a chance to lead and preach. Students always take an active role, learning important skills in worship and song-leading. Special guests are also regularly invited.



Excursions

Various excursions to places of educational interest are organised by class teachers and subject teachers to enhance the studies of the students. Most of all, students look forward to the chance to visit Bhutan in Class IX as part of a one-week voluntary outreach trip that has been organised regularly since 2006.



Academic Excellence

The school conducts three Unit Examinations during the entire school session and another Unit is based on assessment of the students' conduct, book-keeping and activity work for each subject. Performances in the Unit Exams are duly credited to decide the final results. Keeping parents regularly updated enables them to know the specific areas in which they can guide and encourage their children.

Students with outstanding performance in academic subjects are given special scholarships by the school. At the end of the academic session, prizes are distributed to students who have made exceptional achievements in different activities. Students who face particular financial hardship are sometimes offered aid by the school.

In Class X, the students who have demonstrated the most consistent level of excellence in academic and other matters are chosen to be prefects. Prefects take great responsibility for maintaining discipline throughout the school.
